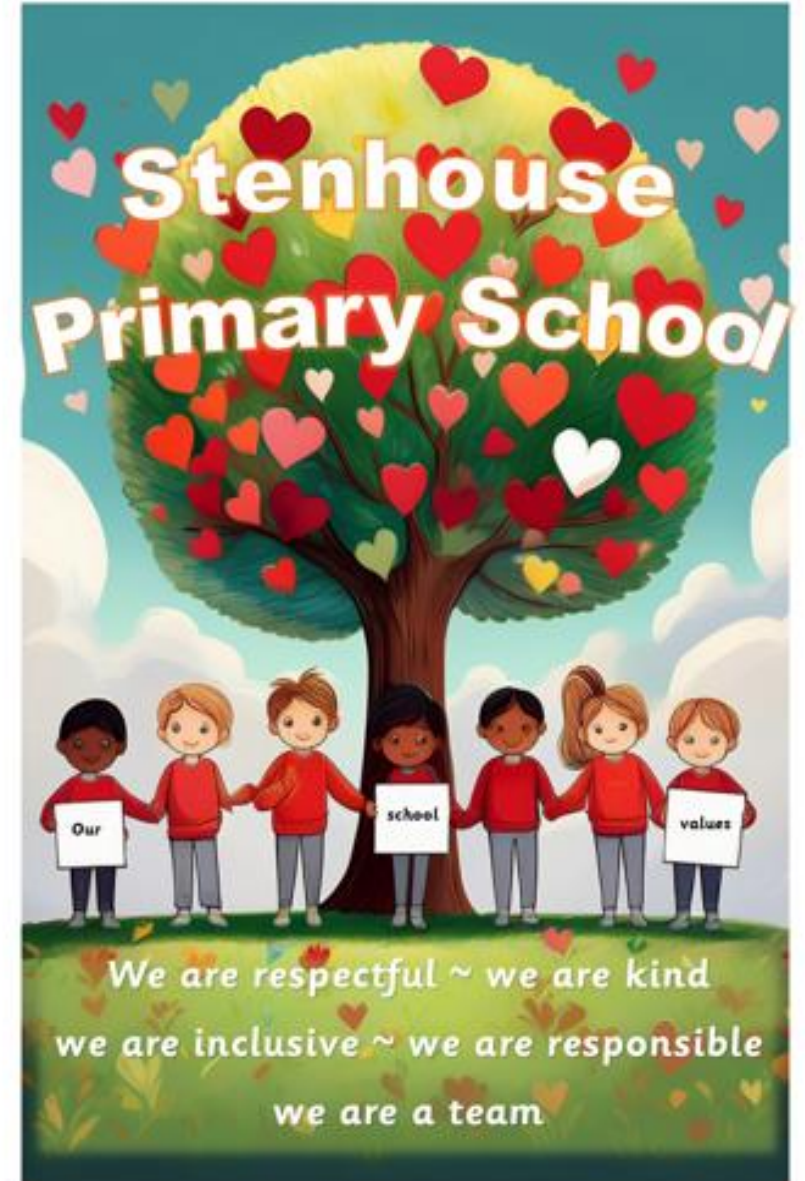
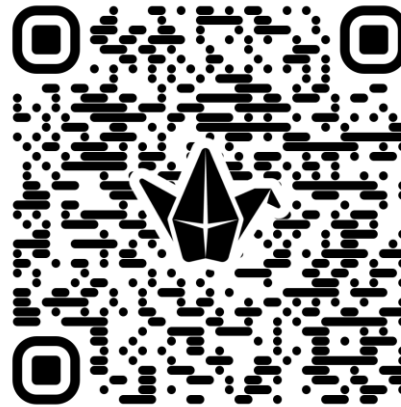

School Uniform and PE Days

Our PE days are:

Wearing school uniform contributes to a positive school ethos, avoid discrimination and reduces peer pressure.

Normal Day

- Jumper, sweatshirt, cardigan and hoodie (black jumper)
- Red or white polo t-shirt, shirt or t-shirt (plain or school logo)
- Skirt, dress (plain or gingham), trousers, leggings or joggers (black, grey or navy)
- Trainers or school shoes

PE Day (to be ready for the day/not getting changed)

- Jumper, sweatshirt, cardigan and hoodie (black jumper)
- Polo t-shirt or t-shirt (red or white)
- Leggings, joggers or shorts (mid-length – black, grey or navy non-branded)
- Trainers

Label clothes

For safety: No Crocs/sandals, false nails or jewellery (studs are fine)




Lunch and Snack

School lunch – must be ordered a week in advance (by midnight on a **Wednesday**) through your online parent pay portal



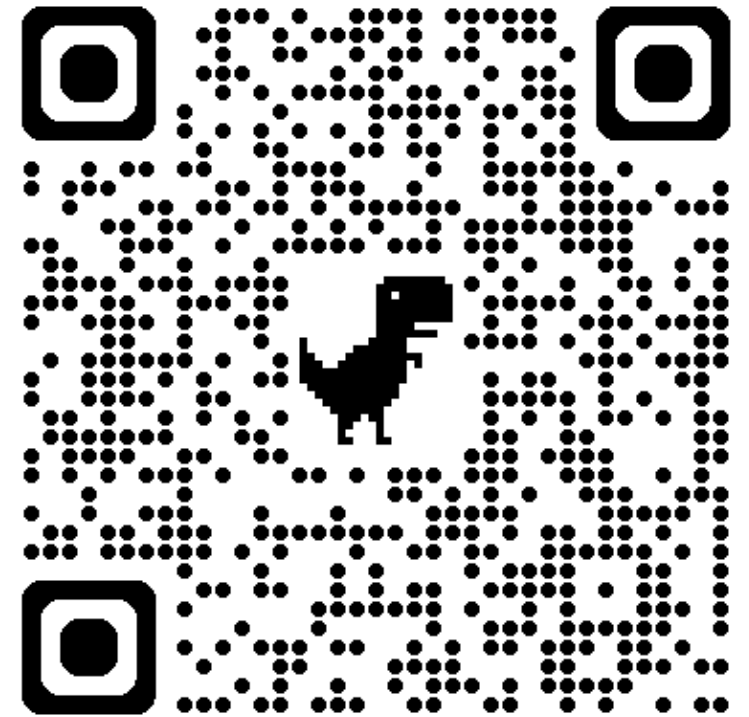
Support with School Meals, Milk and Uniform

Supporting Learning at Home

Reading

Reading, as well as being read to, impacts positively upon children's learning across the curriculum. It also supports mental health and wellbeing. We will be sharing reading for pleasure books for home and would encourage daily reading when possible.

Spelling

Your child will bring home their weekly spelling words to practice at home if you would like to. This is not compulsory. A suggested activity sheet will be provided.

Numeracy

We will share the current multiplication table(s) your child is working on to practice at home. They will have access to their Sumdog account to support mental arithmetic.

Absence and Lateness

An essential part of our safeguarding duty is our ability to account for all children each day. This is in place to ensure that every child leaves home and arrives at school safely.

- Contacting the school office before 8.30 am through a phone call, voicemail, email or text to let us know if your child will be absent from school.
- Arriving at school before 8.45am
