Red or white – plain non-branded or with school logo

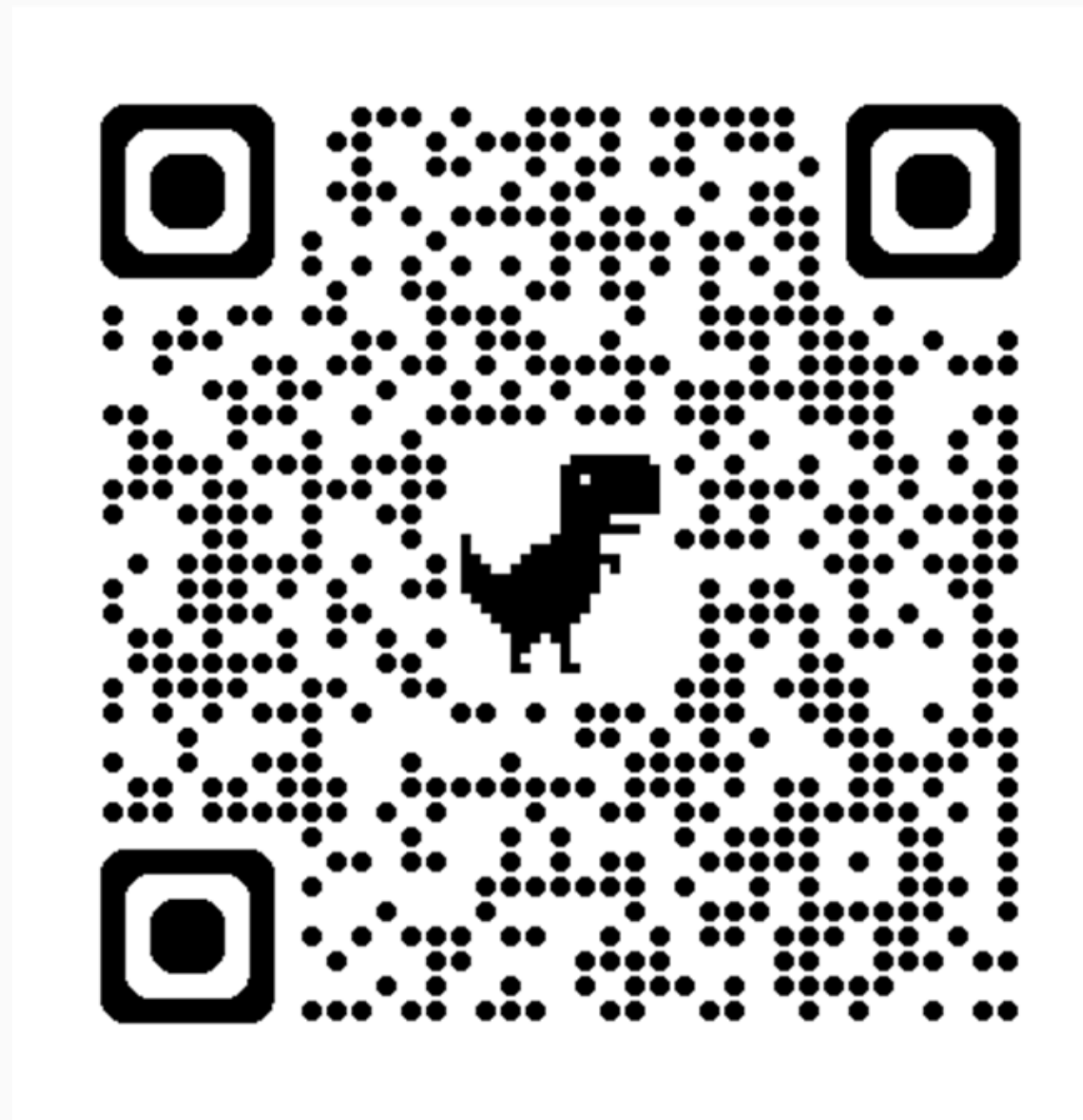
Leggings, joggers or shorts (mid length)

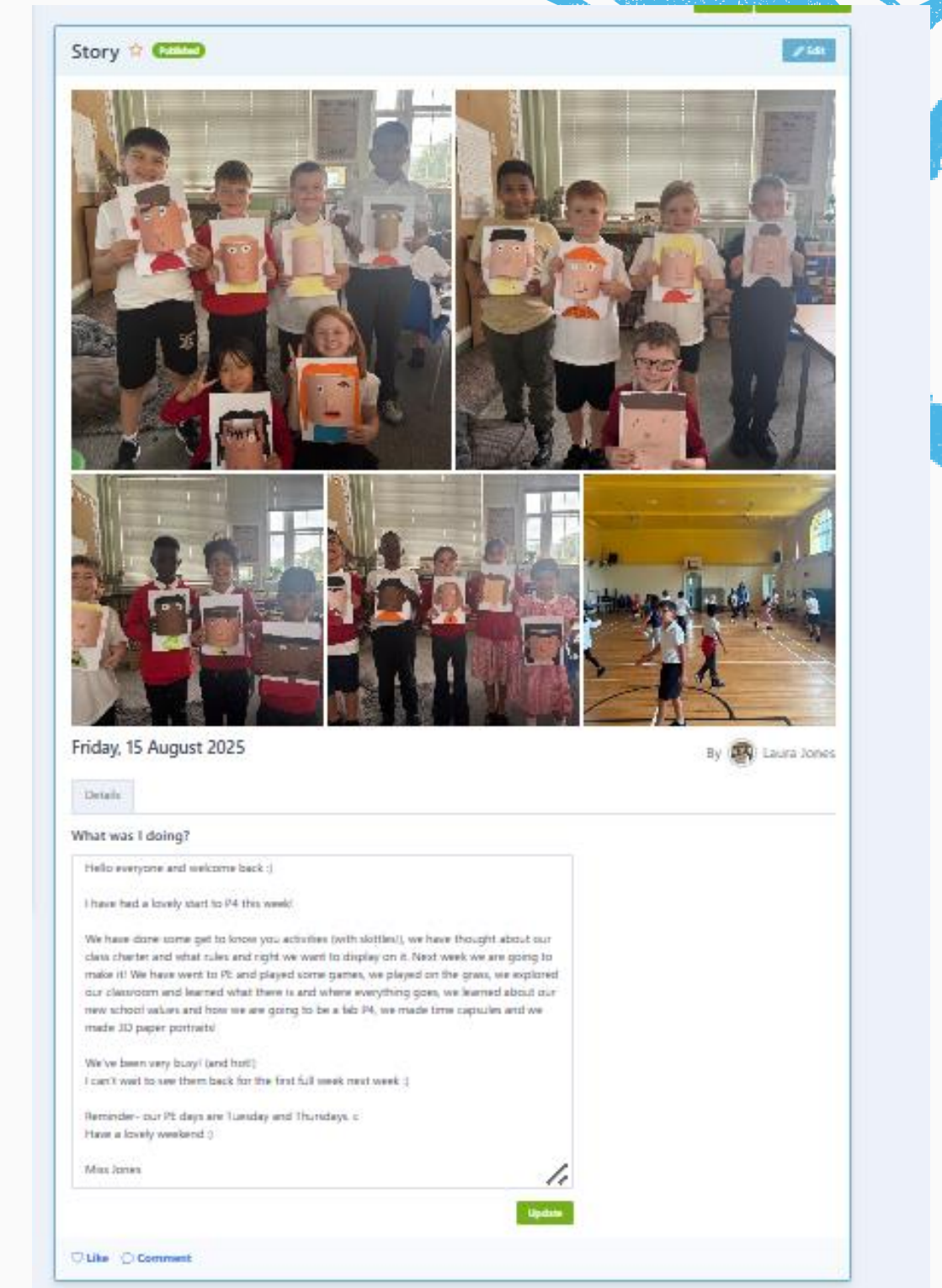
Learning Journals

Learning at Home

Reading

Reading and being read to impacts positively on children's learning across the curriculum and supports mental health and wellbeing. There is a free to a good home bookcase where you can take any books and we would encourage daily reading when possible.

Spelling

In due course, your child will bring home their weekly spelling words to practice at home if you would like to. This is not compulsory. A suggested activity sheet will be provided.

Numeracy

We will share the current times tables your child is working on to practice at home and they will have access to their Sumdog account to support mental arithmetic.

Absence and Lateness

An essential part of our safeguarding duty is our ability to account for all children each day. This is in place to ensure that every child leaves home and arrives at school safely.

Our office staff are currently spending in excess of 2 hours each day following up on unaccounted absences and recording lateness.

Please support us to reduce this by:

- Contacting the school office before 8.30 am through a phone call, voicemail, email or text to let us know if your child will be absent from school.
- Arriving at school before 8.45am
- Ensuring your contact details are up to date
